The Role

- Coordinate, plan and evaluate the delivery (3.5 days per week) and programme content the Boro Health Buses across either East Cleveland and Tees Valley, including driving the bus and developing and rolling out a delivery plan to meet local needs with relevant local delivery organisations.
- Design and adapt the content of delivery in consultation with the Team and local community to meet the needs of individual participants and partner organisations/funders.
- Work with the Health and Wellbeing Manager and Senior Business Development Manager to identify and deliver opportunities to promote and sell the Boro Health Bus package in order to increase unrestricted income and meet financial and impact targets.
- Support Foundation programmes with the use of the Boro Health Bus at sessions and events.
- Build strong relationships with the NHS and local statutory health organisations to use the Boro Health Bus to co-deliver activities within the local community
- Consult with the Designated Safeguarding Officer to understand and support the complex safeguarding and risk requirements of delivery.

Person Requirements

- A valid driving licence with no more than three (3) endorsement points, with access to own transport including business insurance and be eligible to work in the UK
- Commitment and flexibility to working evenings and weekends for the programme delivery and match days on occasion, with willingness to travel within the Tees Valley
- Great planning and organisational skills.
- Experience of selling products to organisations to generate income with an ability to work towards a financial target.
- An excellent knowledge and understanding of safeguarding including principles, procedures and thresholds. A satisfactory enhanced DBS check will need to be completed
- A creative approach to work, with the ability to solve problems and identify mutually beneficial partnership opportunities.
- Relevant driving license PSV/PCV/CPC qualification to drive the Boro Health Buses or willingness to work towards the qualification. (Training will be provided if not already achieved)

These posts fall within the scope of 'regulated activity' and are exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act (1974).
